Projects 2022

Scholarships and Vocational Training



- 17 girls and students in the program.
- 15 youth could start their practical training (vocational).
- 6 youth under 13 years old have been reintegrated into school through our "Back to School"-Program.
- 12 youth completed their vocational and got a financial contribution for their start-up.

Brief Review of the Dagomba Association's Activities

2009 - First Charity-Dinner for the benefit of the women's group in Kulaa (Microcredit)

2011 - Foundation of the Dagomba Association

2013 - Establishment of the Scholarship program for girls

2014 - Start with the P2P-program, later also Early Childhood Education

2015 - Launching a competition for women's groups

2017 - Start of the Vocational program

2019 - Walisu is visiting Switzerland, first implementation of the English Corner

2020 - Corona-emergency aid: Hygiene kits, first time partner donations, school kits for first grade kids

2021 - Corona-emergency: Food donations

2022 - Elderly Support Program, start-up aid for youth completing their vocational

A look back



Some Key Figures:

51 Girls have been supported with scholarships

52 Youth are or went through a vocational training

7 Women's groups were supported in foundation, structure and implementation of a small scale enterprise (start-up funding, seed capital, workshops, coaching)

115 Children of pre-school age could be reached with Peer2Peer and ECE programs

3 times we provided 180 schoolsets for first grade children

4 time we organised extra promotion for school girls (English Corner)

18 Elderly could be supported with food donations and items to improve their mobility (wheelchair, walking aids)

Women

It all started with them. They work tirelessly, always looking for a better living, helping each other, and having a house, yard and children among them.





Walisu

Took us to the villages and to the women, got actively involved, was in Switzerland and prefers to help in the villages.



Jalila

Has been in the scholarship program, has taught the little children in the peer-to-peer program their first numbers, played educational games with them and now teaches in the village school in Kulaa.

Village kids

Are always there when something new happens in the village, improvise, play, help their parents and are curious when there is something to learn.



Look into the future

Projects, that are carried forward:

- Scholarship Program (5Jahre, until 2028)

Projects, that are completed or discontinued:

- Vocational Trainings and start-up aids at graduation
- Scholarships Larabanga
- Women's groups (Seed capital)
- English Corner

Projects, that can be further supported by CFC in an adapted way:

- Women's groups (knowledge exchange) / workshops /

Projects in 2023

Women's groups: Top-up for every group and exchange with women from villages, CFC is supporting.

Workshops: 3-4 during 2023.

Vocational: 15 young people can be approved for a vocational training.

English-Corner: financing of two implementations (2023 and 2024).

Girls Club: not in the current budget.

Larabanga: School fees for 2 girls

74 staff members

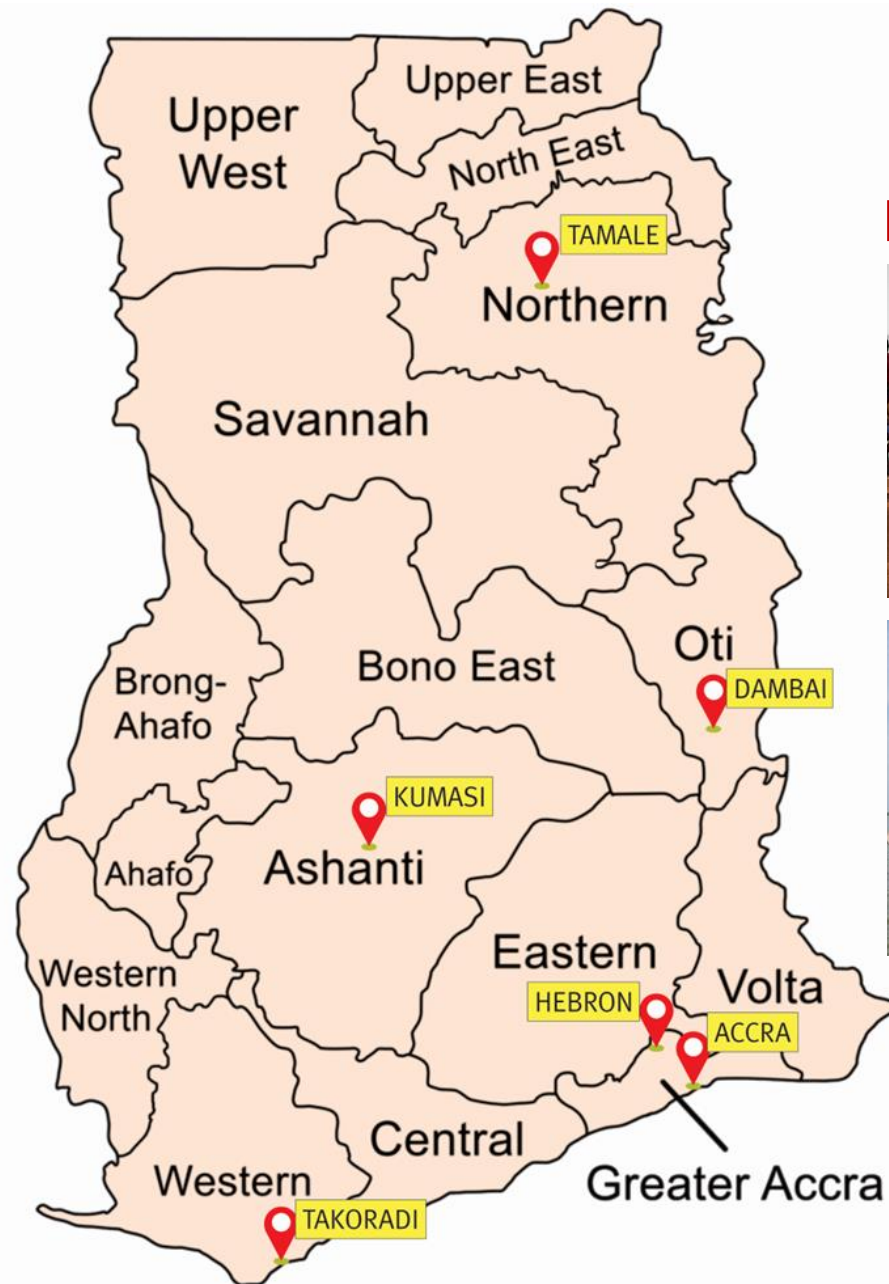

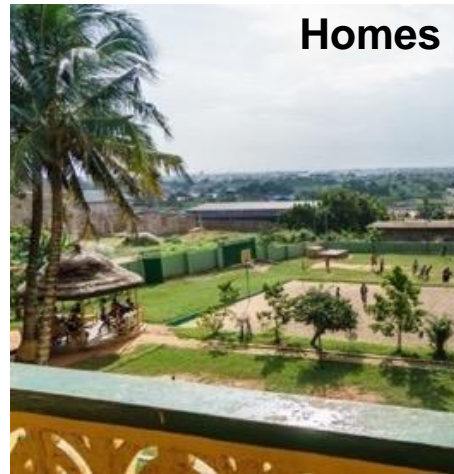

Branch Tamale in an overview

Aktuell:

- 4 staff members
- 127 children supported in their families
- 40 children reached out on the street every month
- Prevention work in 4 communities with monthly workshops and exchanges with the chiefs of the village
- Start of the TVET Program with 10 girls in May 2023
